#### Honorable Muslims!

One of the Companions went near the Prophet Muhammad (saw) and said, "O Messenger of Allah! Give me a piece of advice about Islam so that I will not need to ask anybody else about it." Then, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) said, "Say, 'I have believed in Allah', and be steadfast." <sup>1</sup>

#### Dear Believers!

Human's reason for existence is servitude to Allah, and the most important duty of human is to believe in the existence and oneness of Allah, and live steadfastly as required by such iman (faith). This is because once iman is absorbed in heart, it is manifested in feelings, thoughts, and behaviors. It leads one to the truth and truthfulness as well as honesty and steadfastness. Only then Muslims have a peaceful and honorable life. They become assured of troubles and sorrows both in this world and in the Hereafter. They attain taqwa and divine blessings.
