Dear Muslims!

Addressing to the Prophet (saw), Allah the Almighty states in the Holy Qur'an as follows: "So by mercy from Allah, (O Muhammad), you were lenient with them. And if you had been rude (in speech) and harsh in heart, they would have disbanded from about you..."¹

So, let us take the morality of our Prophet, whose ummah we are honored to be, as an example. Let us adopt compassion and mercy, self-sacrifice and contentment, sweet words and smiling faces as principles. Let us seek peace and happiness not in loneliness and selfishness but in attaining the pleasure of our Lord (swt) and in the du'as of our brothers and sisters.

I would like to conclude this Friday's khutbah with the following hadith of the Messenger of Allah (saw) describing the believer: "The believer is friendly and befriended, for there is no goodness in one who is neither friendly nor befriended."²
