Dear Muslims!

We are in the last days of the holy month of Ramadan. Only a few days are left to reach the peacefulness of 'Eid al-Fitr. These are the days that will save us from the torment of hell. Let us seek refuge in the boundless mercy of our Lord (swt) with the following prayer our beloved Prophet (saw) taught 'A'isha (ra), **"اللَّهُمَّ إِنَّكَ عَفُوٌّ كَرِيمٌ تُحِبُّ الْعَفْوَ فَاعْفُ عَنِّي"** **"O Allah! You are Most Forgiving, and You love forgiveness; so forgive me."**<sup>iii</sup> Let us repent for our sins and ask for forgiveness. It is then that our worries will be relieved, our hearts will be soothed, and our souls will find peace in the presence of the angels that keep descending in groups.
